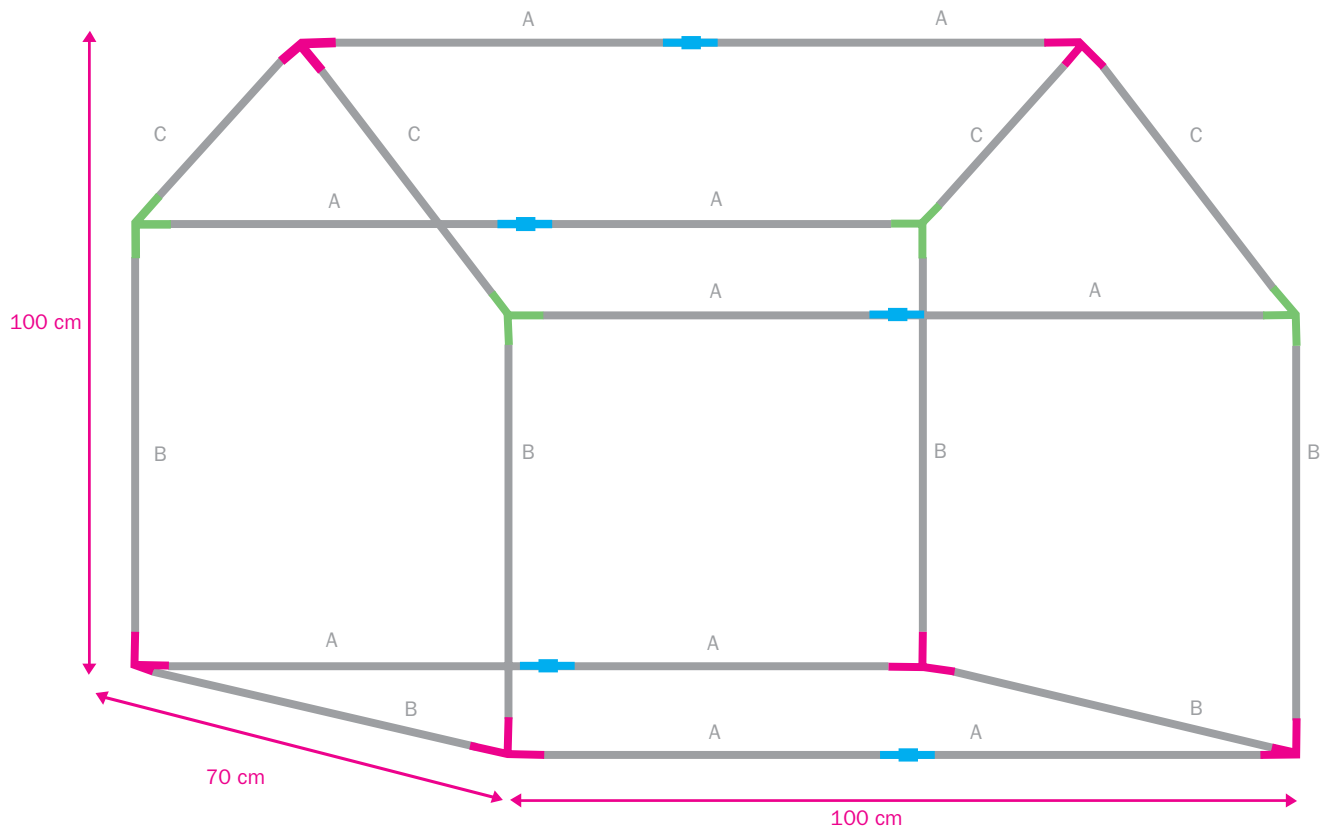



# Constructing the Small Play House



 90° right angle connector x 6

 Straight pole connector x 5

 135° angle connector x 4

Pole A – length 52cm x 10

Pole B – length 69cm x 6

Pole C – length 48cm x 4

- Lay out the poles separating A, B and C. Divide the connectors as shown on the diagram.
- Put the framework together as shown in the diagram. It is essential to ensure all connectors are pushed firmly onto each pole.
- Be careful to use the correct shape connectors for the base of the play house and for the roof.
- Pull the fabric over the frame work. It is designed to be a tight fit. Make sure the top of the roof is correctly in place and then work down to the base.
- Turn the whole play house upside down in order to help pull the fabric into place. The velcro fastens around the base pole to keep the fabric in place.

# Safety and care information

## Safety information

- The fabric of these play houses have been tested for flammability and adhere to the relevant European safety regulations. However as an additional safety precaution, no naked flames should be used in or near the play houses – **keep away from fire.**
- The play house is a toy. The frame is designed only to keep the cover in position and should not be subjected to additional stresses or strains.
- The fabric is 100% cotton and fully complies with European Standard BS EN 71 Parts 1, 2 & 3.

## Age 36+ months. Adult supervision only

- We recommend that an adult assembles our play houses and tents.
- In the interest of safety, remove all plastic bags; these can be dangerous to small children.
